# **SOCIAL NETWORKS**

#### WHAT IS A SOCIAL NETWORK?

Social networks refer to the peer groups to which a particular student belongs.

#### **HOW DO WE MEASURE A SOCIAL NETWORK?**


We administer a classroom-based survey using free recall (class lists/rosters, pictures, names, etc. are not provided in order to ensure the saliency of the nominated peer groups)

• Peer groups are as small as dyads and as large as the entire class

We ask each child in the same classroom to complete the survey (see below; 5-10 minutes)

- In the past, we have used this survey with preschool through high school students (Note: preschool children were individually interviewed, and the interviewer recorded their responses)
- Children are allowed to nominate themselves
- · Children are reminded to include their classmates

# **HOW IS A SOCIAL NETWORK GENERATED?:**

From the classroom-based survey, we gather two pieces of information:

- Individual Centrality the number of nominations a child receives as part of any peer group
- Cluster Centrality the average of two highest cluster members' individual centrality

Peripheral (bottom 30% of the classroom)	Low, Medium, or High	Low
Isolated	Any	Belongs to No Cluster

# WHAT OTHER DATA ARE PROVIDED?

The survey also provides information on the following:

- Friendship Nominations the number of times a child was nominated as a "friend" by their classmates
- Friendship Reciprocity whether the child's nominated friend also selected them as a friend
- Rejections the number of times a child was nominated as "someone other children do not like to hang out with"
- Peer Connections the number of peer connections a child has in their classroom
