

2022-2023 School Year: Essential Standards Student Proficiency Chart

Purpose: The charts below provide a high-level overview of student learning on each of the Essential Standards covered during the 2022-23 school year. The purpose of this information is to make student proficiency data visible to all team members, to help each team make responsive instructional decisions (in-year), and to help each team analyze instructional program decisions (end of year).

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In- Year Process Steps--

- 1. <u>List the Essential Standards</u> taught throughout the 2022-23 school year. This can be listed up front, at the beginning of the year, or listed as you go through the year.
- 2. Record student proficiency at the end of the instructional unit:
 - a. Overall Student Proficiency (L3 and L4).
 - b. Special Education Subgroup Proficiency
 - c. MLL Subgroup Proficiency Where data is disaggregated, include SpEd and ELL specific data.
 - d. If you do not have quantitative data about a skill but have information that is relevant to recording progress, please list that information under the "Anecdotal Data" section of each chart.
- 3. At the end of the Instructional Unit, Analyze what the information tells you:
 - a. What do the data show about how our instructional decisions impacted student growth?
 - b. What do the data show about what we need to focus on to ensure ALL students have opportunities to make growth on this skill throughout the school year?
 - c. What do the data show about what we need to focus on next year when we teach this essential?

Year-End Process Steps--

- 4. List any Essential Standards not covered this year.
- 5. Send / provide information to the next grade level team at the end of year.
- 6. Compare Essential Standards data tracking to SBA and iReady data, to evaluate areas of work and growth for 2023-24.
