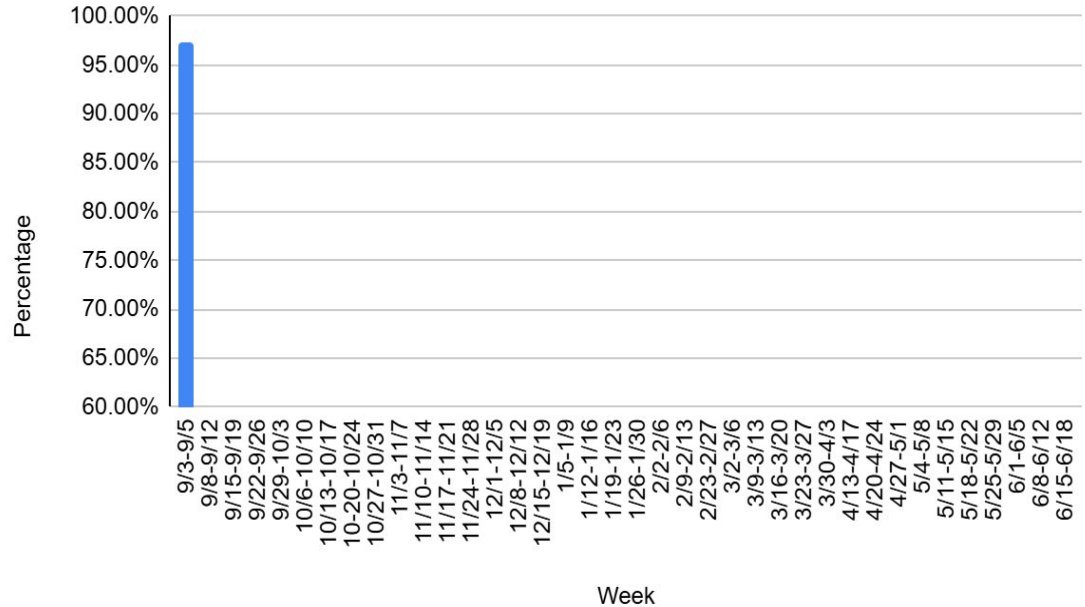

Fire Drill Today



If we need to get out of our school because it is on fire:

STUDENTS:

- **Quickly and quietly** exit the building and go to your line up spot on the turf on our playground. Face away from the school. If your teacher is not with you, you should still go to your line up spot.
- Stay **calm and quiet**.
- Your teacher, or an adult will take attendance and might give you a name badge if they are available. Keep your name badge on until you are told to take it off.
- **Sit down on the ground** and wait for further instructions.

Staff:

- **Exit the building** to your evacuation spot
- **Take attendance** by giving your students their name badge if you have them.
- **Check your buddy** classes/staff
- **Hold up your “Green” all is OK or “RED”** Need Help sign as long as it takes for someone to come find out what you need.
- Fill out your **“Teacher Evacuation”** form and give it to our Assembly team Leader
- **Wait for further instructions**

Lunch



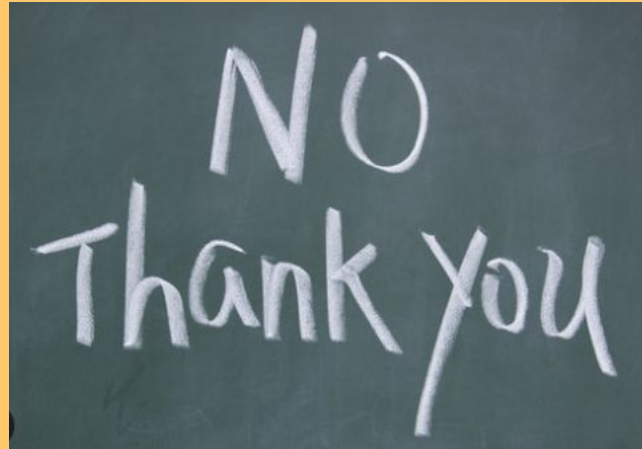
- ★ Line up immediately when duty tells you to

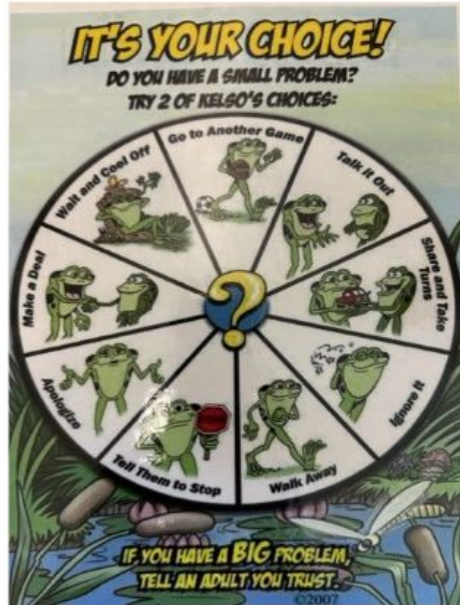
Reces S Expectation S

Restroom/Water Breaks

1. Get a pass from the recess supervisor
2. Enter the building through the double doors by the gym.
3. Step 3: Go -> Flush -> Wash -> Leave
 - a. Use the restroom (Go),
 - b. Toilet paper goes IN the toilet,
 - c. Flush the toilet/urinal (Flush),
 - d. Wash your hands (Wash),
 - e. Return to recess (Leave)...
4. Use a Level 0 voice while in the building



Announcements: Playground Whistles

1 Short Whistle

Students turn and look to see who the recess supervisors are needing.

- If it is not you, you can go back to your activity.
- If it is you, look at the recess supervisor and follow their directions.

3 Short Whistles

Students stop whatever activity they are doing and proceed to line-up to go to lunch or back to class. Please go to your assigned line-up spot for your class.

1 Long Whistle

Students stop what they are doing freeze and look and listen to directions.



Bus Expectations

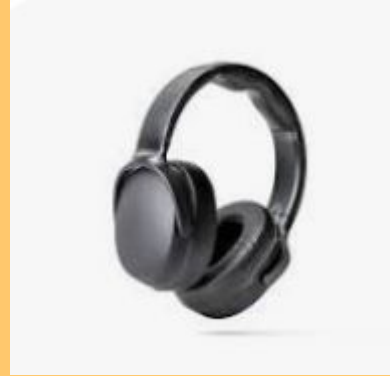
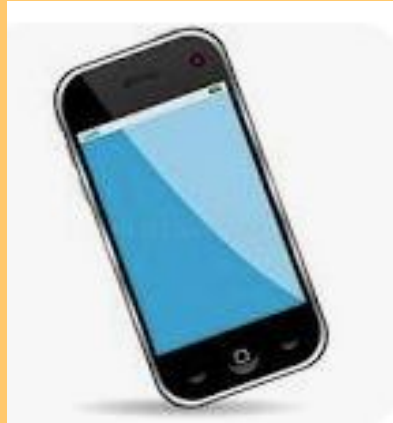
- 1. I will not switch seats.**

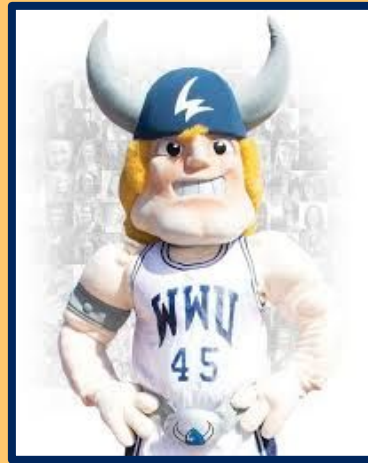
